## Grizzly Bears

As some of you may have heard, a grizzly bear population study was proposed for this summer. This has since been postponed to allow for more public awareness and consultation to occur. This fall, information sheets will be printed and distributed to residents of the Champagne-Aishihik Traditional Territory. We are holding a public meeting end of October to start and we need to hear from you. This study was an ongoing action item from the Aishihik Integrated Wildlife Mgmt. Plan that was moved forward to the Draft Champagne-Aishihik Traditional Territory (CATT) Integrated Wildlife Mgmt. Plan.

## Ground Based Monitoring

Last year the Council started to collect bear observations in the CATT and handed out "Bear Books" to people who travelled certain areas regularly. We are doing this again would like to expand on what is observed and when.

Developing a Ground Based Monitoring Program is another action item in the CATT-Integrated Wildlife Mgmt. Plan. Are you interested in participating? Do you have experience with ground based monitoring that you could share? Do you have suggestions for species to monitor? Let us know.
